

Retirement Issues Committee Annual Report

2016

This past year has been an extremely busy one for this small committee, as evidence from the great deal of accomplishments we have succeeded in bringing to fruition under the CSFA banner:

1. We were able to launch the retiree web page that encompasses a one stop shop that retirees could go to for benefit information, ongoing memorial page, and general information on CSFA as it related to the retiree, along with committee reports.
2. We also launched CSFA's extremely active Retiree's Facebook page.
3. Seeing the need to self-fund the committee and future programs, we started the sale of CSFA Retired Stickers and 12oz. glass beer glasses with the CSFA Retired Sticker painted on the glass. Would like to see profits from sale of glassware at this time to go to Steamer Team, even if it's to start a fund to bring them to the 100 anniversary conference in 6 years.
4. We met with CSFEWBC to bring on an Independent Medical Insurance Broker (still in the works).
5. Our biggest endeavor was to put on eleven CSFA Social Media 101 Classes and eleven Social Media for Disaster Response and Recovery (PER 304) Courses. These FREE classes were held in eleven locations throughout the state: Ceres Fire Department, Long Beach Fire Department, Red Helmet Training Center in Rancho Cucamonga, Chowchilla Fire Department, Costa Mesa Fire Department held at National University, Arcadia Fire Department, Healdsburg Fire Department, Winters Fire Department, Quincy Fire Department, Imperial County Fire Department, and Riverside Fire Department. While these were the locations for the different classes held, the 344 participants were comprised of 133 different agencies from all over the state. I want to thank the two primary instructors, Steve Wood and Earle Kealoha, both retired Firefighters and CSFA Members, for developing the curriculum for the Social Media 101 Class and their hard work and traveling across the state to teach these classes. Information on other classes that CSFA might want to get involved with from NDPTC has been passed on to the Board and staff in earlier emails.

One needs to know that this committee could not have accomplished all the above without a great deal of assistance from the K Street Staff. We would like to thank Anne Mullinax, Julie Cheline, Genia Vargas, Monty Gearhart and Gary Giacomo. The personal from CAL OES also need to be thank they also assisted us in a great way of getting the word out to many agencies across the state about the Social Media Classes.
